

7 A strong Bundeswehr as the guarantor of a sovereign nation

We will:

provide the Bundeswehr with the financial, material and personnel resources it needs to fulfil its constitutional mandate of national defence – as the strongest armed forces of a sovereign Germany in a well-defended Europe.

8 Strengthen families – reward parenting

We will:

introduce a childcare allowance for parents and grandparents to ensure genuine freedom of choice and to recognise the value of parenting (Drs. 20/71SS);

introduce a family tax splitting scheme that takes the number of children into account for income tax purposes and provides significant relief for large families (Drs. 20/4G72);

introduce an interest-free loan for parents following the birth of their children;

curb the influence of gender ideology and restrict gender reassignment

9 Strengthen personal responsibility for health

We will:

guarantee physical integrity and therefore reject compulsory vaccinations;

provide appropriate compensation and care for all victims of vaccination;

promote research into vaccine-related harm and hold the pharmaceutical industry accountable in this regard;

evaluate all COVID-19 measures and address the injustices that have occurred through legal channels.

10 Education is the future for Germany

We will:

free education, science and research from ideology, put a stop to censorship and cancel culture and promote research into modern nuclear energy, combustion engine and fuel technologies;

strengthen the dual vocational training system by making master craftsman training free of charge (Drs. 20/5225). We want to maintain and expand vocational schools in order to attract skilled workers for industry, the trades and commerce;

Make educational attainment and educational aptitude a decisive criterion in immigration policy;

ban gender-neutral language in all ministries, public authorities and institutions, and enshrine German as the national and educational language in the Basic Law (Drs. 20/7348).

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More and more citizens are realising that the 'traffic light' coalition is driving our country into ruin. To lead Germany out of the crisis, we will swiftly implement the following measures once in government:

Economy & Energy

Halting the deindustrialisation of Germany

We will:

- pull our country out of recession and halt deindustrialisation. To this end, we will, above all, ensure lower energy prices by expanding supply, scrapping the CO₂ levy outright and reducing energy taxes. We will drastically cut red tape, for example by abolishing the Delivery List Act;

- drastically reduce government spending on migration; climate policy and development aid; and invest in infrastructure instead – the debt brake must be adhered to;

- repair the Nord Stream pipelines and bring them back into operation, as well as reactivate all operational nuclear power stations and, in the long term, build new ones (Drs. 20/G18S);

- Completely end the so-called energy transition. We will ensure technological neutrality and abolish subsidies for non-fossil technologies as well as bans on fossil technologies;

- Put an end to the "transport transition". We aim to thoroughly re-educate the population and do not wish to restrict freedom of choice regarding means of transport. We will reverse an EU-wide ban on internal combustion engines.

Budget & Finance

More freedom, lower taxes for citizens and businesses

We will:

- ease the burden on citizens and businesses by reducing electricity and energy taxes to a minimum, and by abolishing air transport tax, property tax, the CO₂ levy and the solidarity surcharge without replacement;

- reduce the mileage allowance (commuter allowance) by

- Increase the fare for the first kilometre to 50 cents;

- enshrine cash as a means of payment in the Basic Law – even against the will of the European Union (Drs. 1S/147G1);

- open negotiations to reduce our EU contributions and to establish a European Economic and Interest Community;

- enable direct democracy and let citizens decide through referendums;

Immigration

Immediately put an end to the disastrous migration policy

We will:

- put a stop to the influx into our social welfare systems by introducing in-kind benefits rather than cash payments for refugees and migrants (Drs. 20/5225);

- prevent illegal immigration through effective border protection and consistently deport all illegal migrants or those who have committed criminal offences;

- establish a right to naturalisation in the interests of Germany. Naturalisation must be subject to high thresholds (Drs. 20/4845).

Work & Social Affairs

Save our welfare state

We will:

- get everyone of working age into employment through a 'challenge and support' approach (an activating basic income rather than a universal basic income), thereby strengthening the social security system;

- ensure higher net wages by reducing the tax burden;

- consistently tackle the misuse of social security benefits;

- Prevent poverty in old age through fair pensions.

Security & Justice

Make Germany safe again

We will:

- optimise the staffing and equipment of the Federal Police and expand its powers to tackle the migration crisis;

- effectively combat knife crime and clan-related crime: non-Germans must be deported in this context;

- set the right priorities for internal security: we will combat extremism of all kinds, including Islamism and left-wing extremism, with the utmost severity.

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In the interests of Germany in a multipolar world

We will:

- to pursue a foreign policy that represents German interests in a multipolar world order and is committed to peace. An AfD-led federal government will work, in collaboration with the OSCE, to secure a ceasefire in the Ukraine, which is a prerequisite for long-term prospects for peace (Drs. 20/5551).
